

#### **LANDING PAGE**

You (hopefully) already have a dedicated giving page on your church website. Creating a separate, but similar page specifically

catered to year-end giving can help you direct people from other sources. It also allows you to include specific messaging for the campaign. Build an optimal donation landing page by including the below features:

#### **FEATURES**

**Web address:** Provide a URL that is easy to remember and type, Eg. www.yourchurch.com/2020giving.

**Donation form:** Make it easy to give! Embed a donation form at the top of the page, or drop a button that directs people to a donation form.

Other ways to give: If your church has other ways of accepting donations, such as check or cash, be sure to provide details for how donors can give in those ways.

**Images:** Use clean, copyright-appropriate images that complement the purpose of the page. Either use photos you have taken yourself, or stock photos from Unsplash or Pexels.

**Reasons to give:** Merely asking your church to donate is not effective—you must encourage by telling them why it is important to do so. This may include providing some type of data that can show the impact giving had on your church in the past year.

**User login:** If you use a giving software, like Tithely, allow members to create a login and view their giving history quickly and easily. Transparency goes a long way.

**Mobile friendly:** It is important to ensure your website translates well on different devices. So be sure to test out the landing page on smartphones and tablets as it is likely most church members will be viewing your website via a mobile device.

#### **SERMON ILLUSTRATIONS**

#### **Zacchaeus Pays His Reparations (Luke 9:8)**

Many of us have heard the story of Zacchaeus. We remember the part when he wants to meet Christ, so he climbs a tree. We especially recall Zacchaeus' height, or rather lack thereof. But what we sometimes forget about Zacchaeus is that he was a tax collector. That is one of the reasons why he was despised in his hometown—he was greedy and took money from others. But after meeting Christ, he gave back the money he took and then some. No one is beyond saving for Jesus. And even the most corrupt among us can start to make amends by being generous and asking for forgiveness.

#### **Storing Up Treasures on Earth (Luke 12:16-21)**

In the book of Luke, Jesus tells a parable about a wealthy man who tried to store up treasures on Earth. The man had a bountiful harvest, so he built up large barns to stash away for a rainy day, then Jesus asked what the man would do if God were to claim his life the next day. The moral of the story is that all of your earthly possessions won't mean a thing. Instead, we are called to store up treasures in heaven, which lasts for eternity. Giving back to the church creates a lasting legacy.

#### The Widow's Oil (2 Kings 4:1-7)

The prophet Elisha once encountered a widow who was being hounded by creditors. They were threatening to take away her two sons as their slaves if she was unable to pay up. All she had was a small jar of olive oil. Elisha instructed her to collect empty jars from neighbors and pour the oil into it. She did so and found that the oil filled all of the jars and did not stop flowing. This

reminds us that God always provides for us miraculously, even in our time of greatest need. All we need to do is come to God with our needs and trust Him with His instructions.

#### Feeding the Five Thousand (Matthew 14:14-21)

Christ feeding the five thousand is a story most people know well. Jesus was preaching to a large crowd who became hungry, but the only food was a loaf of bread and a few fish provided by a young boy. Miraculously, Jesus transforms it into a feast that satisfies everyone. So what does this have to do with generosity? Well, consider the young boy who brought the food. How could he have imagined that his tiny snack could have fed everyone? But he gave it up regardless and God did amazing things with that obedience. When we are willing to give up what little we have, Jesus is able to do big things that will help many others.

#### The Macedonian churches (2 Corinthians 8)

In his second letter to the church at Corinth, Paul mentions another group of churches in Macedonia. According to the epistle, these churches were experiencing some financial difficulties. However, they came together in joy to raise money and support one another. Paul mentions this as a word of encouragement to the Corinthians. He says that they excel at many other things and should test themselves to get better at the "grace of giving." The churches in Macedonia were able to thrive during their trials because of their unity and their generosity.

#### **RESPONSIVE READING**

#### Option 1

- Pastor: God calls us to give thanks for our many blessings.
- Congregation: We give thanks to the Lord.
- Pastor: All good things come from our Father who is in Heaven.
   Every good and perfect gift is sent to us from above. Let us send our gratitude to He who shares His bounty with us.
- Congregation: We lift our praises up to our Heavenly Father.

- Pastor: Remember that God provides for each of us in our time of need.
- Congregation: It is good to give thanks.
- Pastor: It is right and good to acknowledge our Lord Jesus, who cares for each one of us in our time of need. It is in His holy name we pray.
- All: Amen.

#### **Option 2**

- Pastor: We are called by God to care for those who are in need.
- Congregation: We will do our part to give back to others.
- Pastor: Christ our savior tells us that when one sheep leaves the flock, the good shepherd follows after him and protects him from harm.
- Congregation: We will follow the example of Christ.
- **Pastor:** Christ commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves. As the body of Christ, we are to be a light for those around us. We are the hands and feet of Him who died for us.
- Congregation: We will do what is right for the good of our neighbors.
- **Pastor:** We love the world because God loved the world. It's in His heavenly name we pray.
- All: Amen.

#### **SERMON OUTLINES**

Preaching about generosity and giving can be intimidating, but there is plenty of scripture that supports this important topic. Below you can find a helpful outline of messages that could be shared from the stage. You could even work in some of the sermon illustrations provided in another section as needed. Be sure to make it your own with personal stories and your unique voice.

#### **Giving the Gift**

- It is a well-known Christmas tradition to give presents.
- We all have memories as a child of opening the perfect gift.

- [Share a personal story of a gift you received as a child.]
- We know that this tradition comes from the three wise men bringing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to Jesus. (Matthew 2:1-12)
- It is also symbolic because Christ is the greatest gift we could receive on this earth. (John 3:16; Romans 6:23)
- But could we possibly honor his birth by using this time to help others?
- What are some things you could be doing to help others this holiday season?
- [Share some of the things that your church is doing to help the community this season.]
- While Christmas is a happy time of celebration for many, it is often a holiday that brings depression and loneliness for many others. Think about those who have lost loved ones this year.
- Consider what you could be doing to use your gift to bring cheer to those around you.
- One thing you could do is to make a generous year-end gift to the church. This money will be going towards: [share how the year-end funds will be used at the church].
- [Share other examples of ways church members could give back beyond just donating; eg. volunteering their time, writing letters, etc.]
- We spend enough money on Christmas presents every year.
   They are fun ways to celebrate, but we should also share our blessings with those with less to celebrate.

#### **This Changes Everything**

- 2020 is a year we will not soon (or ever) forget.
- A hundred years from now, people will remember the start of the Coronavirus pandemic.
- This year is when everything changed for everyone around the world.
- How we act during this time will also be remembered.
- It has been very difficult for a number of reasons, but that doesn't mean there has not been any good to come of it.

- How we respond during a crisis is a true reflection of our character. (2 Corinthians 4:16-18; Ecclesiastes 3:1)
- [Share personal examples of people who have thrived in crisis.]
- About 2,000 years ago, there was a year that changed everything.
- So many years later, we still celebrate the birth of Jesus and tell the story. (Luke 2:1-20)
- Christ came to save mankind from sin, which changes everything, even more than COVID-19.
- These times of change are when our responses matter most.
- Are you acting in a way that you'll be proud to remember years later?
- We have the opportunity to make a positive impact on our community amidst the conflict.
- Oneway you can help make a difference is by supporting your local church.
